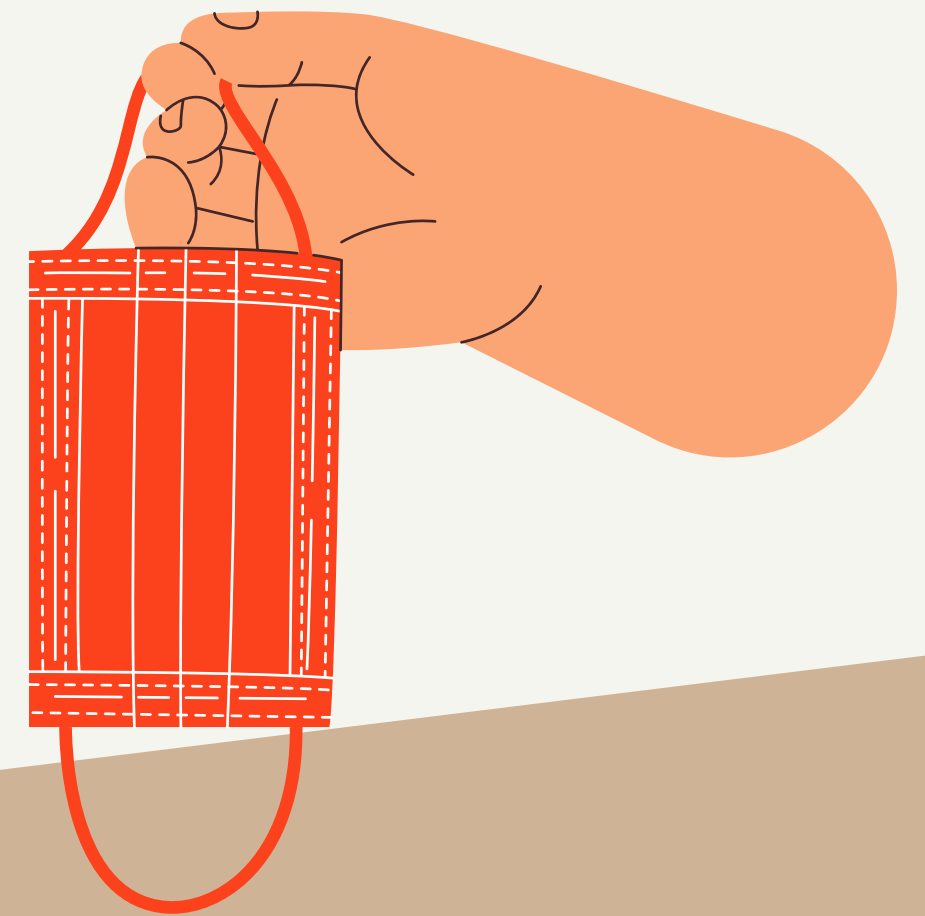

what to do?

- Do not litter.
